The [Brainworks](#) office, 79 Ridout Street South, in Wortley Village, was built in 1910. Its first owner was Jose Gaste, owner of a cigar factory in the days when London cigar factories produced over 20 million cigars each year.



This year, for the first time, Brainworks is a participant in Doors Open, an annual event which provides access to historic buildings not usually open to the public. The Brainworks building will be open on Saturday, September 18 and Sunday, September 19 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The public is cordially welcome to visit on these days and to attend the sign unveiling.

Brainworks' office building was designated a historic property by the City of London in 1991. The many features which visitors will be able to see are maintained by Brainworks as part of its responsibility as a heritage property owner.
